THIS DELEGATION OF PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY IS VALID UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 20\_\_\_\_, UNLESS PREVIOUSLY TERMINATED BY THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, THE PRIMARY SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN, OR THE NORTH DAKOTA BOARD OF MEDICINE.

Pursuant to §43-17-02.1, NDCC, "A physician assistant may prescribe medications, as delegated to do so by a supervising physician. This may include Schedule II through V controlled substances. A physician assistant who is a delegated prescriber of controlled substances must register with the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration".

**Note:** No physician assistant is authorized to issue prescriptions until a supervising physician has delegated the authority to do so. For Schedule II, III, IV, and V drugs, DEA registration is also required.
